



DIRECTIVE 2018-011

January 30, 2018

Re: CONSIDERATION OF A REQUEST BY THE UNIVERSITY OF TOLEDO TO CONTINUE TO WAIVE STANDARD TUITION RATES FOR OHIO NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS WHO DO NOT RECEIVE FUNDING UNDER THE COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS PROGRAM.

§375.30.30 of Am. Sub. H.B. 119 of the 127th General Assembly required any waiver of tuition for a student or class of students not otherwise permitted by law at a state-assisted institution of higher education be approved by the Chancellor of Higher Education (the “Chancellor”). On April 17, 2009, the Chancellor signed Directive 2009-011 establishing procedures for institutions to follow when requesting to waive standard tuition rates. §381.170 of Am. Sub. H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly continues this authority of the Chancellor for the biennium.

Pursuant to §381.170 of Am. Sub. H.B. 49 as well as Directive 2009-011, the University of Toledo (“UT”) has requested for academic year 2018-2019 to waive standard tuition rates for nonpublic high school students that do not receive funding under College Credit Plus

UT has demonstrated the following:


- UT’s Board of Trustees approved a resolution authorizing this tuition waiver at its meeting on December 18, 2017. A copy of the resolution is attached.
- UT has submitted a specific request to reduce tuition as follows:
 - For students attending a non-public school with a current College Credit Plus partnership with UT -
 - UT will charge \$140.00 per credit hour for on-campus classes. This is a waiver of 195.49.
 - UT will charge \$80.00 for UT online courses and UT faculty off campus. This is a waiver of 255.49.
 - UT will charge \$41.64 for credentialed qualified teacher-adjuncts teaching the course at the high school. This is a waiver of 293.99.
 - For non-public schools without a current College Credit Plus partnership with UT

- UT will charge \$166.55 per credit hour for on-campus classes and online courses. This is a waiver of \$168.94.
 - UT will charge \$83.28 for UT faculty teaching off-campus. This is a waiver of \$252.21
 - UT will charge \$41.64 for credentialed qualified teacher-adjuncts teaching the course at the high school. This is a waiver of \$293.85.
- UT proposes that the duration of the waiver be academic year 2018-2019.
 - It is estimated that the proposed waiver will affect 25 students.
 - The goals of this tuition waiver is to provide equal access to affordable higher education opportunities for all students in the Toledo region. This is the same goal as the previous waiver. UT noted that the participation in the previous waiver was minimal, but that it was a valuable recruitment tool.
 - UT will monitor high school enrollments and completion information by term for the students under this waiver to ensure it is meeting its goal.

Agency staff reviewed the request and posted its recommendations to the Ohio Department of Higher Education's website for purposes of providing a period of public comment before final approval by the Chancellor. No public comments were received.

Based upon my review and staff recommendations, I hereby approve the tuition waiver request from University of Toledo as set forth above for academic year 2018-2019.

This directive will take immediate effect.

RESOLUTION NO. 17-12-30

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS TUITION WAIVER

- WHEREAS, The University of Toledo is fully engaged in College Credit Plus (CCP) as outlined in section Ohio Revised Code §3365; and
- WHEREAS, Directive 2009-011 established procedures for institutions requesting the Chancellor's approval of tuition waivers; and
- WHEREAS, for qualified, Ohio non-public school students, the University wishes to provide the opportunity to earn the credit hours for which the student applied but was not awarded State funding for CCP at a reduction from the standard tuition rate; and
- WHEREAS, The University of Toledo standard in-state tuition per credit hour is \$335.49; and
- WHEREAS, the specific amount of the tuition reduction will depend on whether the student attends a non-public school with a current CCP partnership (i.e., alternative funding structure agreement) with the University; and
- WHEREAS, it is anticipated that 25 students will take advantage of this opportunity in the 2018-2019 academic year; and
- WHEREAS, The University of Toledo offers the CCP program in four learning modalities as follows:
1. Delivered on the University campus
 2. Delivered online
 3. Delivered off-campus by University faculty
 4. Delivered off-campus by faculty-credentialed high school teachers; and
- WHEREAS, the impact and success of the CCP Non-Public Schools Tuition Waiver will be reviewed annually.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

to provide the opportunity for qualified, Ohio non-public school students to earn the credit hours for which the student applied but was not awarded State funding for CCP, pending approval by the Chancellor of the Ohio Department of Education, The University of Toledo Board of Trustees authorizes as follows:

- A. For students attending a non-public school with a current CCP partnership with the University, the per credit hour rate will be as set forth by the Board of Trustees Resolution No. 17-12-29 CCP Alternative Funding for 2018-2019, specifically:

1. Courses delivered on the University campus – \$140 per credit hour;
 2. Courses delivered Online - \$80 per credit hour;
 3. Courses delivered off-campus by University faculty – \$80 per credit hour; and
 4. Courses delivered off-campus by faculty-credentialed high school teachers – \$41.64 per credit hour
- B. For students attending a non-public school without a current CCP partnership with the University, the per credit hour rate will be the CCP default rates as set forth by the Ohio Department of Higher Education for the 2018-2019 academic year within the CCP program pursuant to Ohio Revised Code §33365, specifically:
1. Courses delivered on the University campus – \$166.55 per credit hour;
 2. Courses delivered Online – \$166.55 per credit hour;
 3. Courses delivered off-campus by University faculty – \$83.28 per credit hour; and
 4. Courses delivered off-campus by faculty-credentialed high school teachers - \$41.64 per credit hour.
