Bachelor of Science in Aviation Maintenance Management

Request:

Kent State University requests approval to offer a Bachelor of Science in Aviation Maintenance Management degree.

Background:

Kent State University is a public university located in Kent, Ohio, with seven additional campuses throughout Northeastern Ohio, and was originally founded as a teacher-training school. Today, the university enrolls more than 37,000 undergraduate and graduate students in more than 300 programs, from the associate degree level to the doctoral level. Kent State University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission until its next scheduled review in 2024-25.

Curriculum and Enrollment:

The Bachelor of Science in Aviation Maintenance Management degree is composed of 120 semester hours. The program will prepare individuals to apply technical knowledge and skills to repair, service, and maintain all aircraft components other than engines, propellers, avionics, and instruments. The program includes coursework in introduction to aviation maintenance management; professional development in aeronautics; aviation communications; human factors in aviation management; business finance; aviation safety theory; human resource management; principles of marketing; advanced aircraft composite technology; inspection authorization; labor relations in the aviation industry; turbine engine theory and operation; core composition; social sciences; basic science; and Federal Aviation Agency airframe and power plant certification.

Kent State University projects a full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment of 30 students in year one growing to 114 FTE in the fourth year.

Faculty and Resources:

Kent State University has adequately planned for faculty and resources to deliver the program. No additional facilities are needed to support this program.

Recommendation:

After review of the proposal, the Chancellor's staff recommends approval for the program. Approval may be withdrawn if, in the Chancellor's judgement, Kent State University fails to continue to meet the Chancellor's standards for graduate degree programs or receives a sanction from the Higher Learning Commission.
