Multi-Age Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) Endorsement

Request:

Ohio Dominican University requests approval to offer a graduate level program leading to the Ohio Multi-Age TESOL Endorsement.

Profile:

Ohio Dominican University is a private, not-for-profit university affiliated with the Catholic church. The university was founded in 1911 as the College of Saint Mary of the Springs with a specific mission to educate all individuals committed to intellectual, spiritual and professional growth to become lifelong learners committed to serving others in a global society, as ethical and effective leaders grounded in the pursuit of truth, justice and peace. Located in Columbus, Ohio, the university has an enrollment of over 1,800 undergraduate and more than 800 graduate students.

Accreditation/Authorization:

Ohio Dominican University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) until its next scheduled review in 2018. Ohio Dominican University's educator preparation programs are accredited by National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) until the next review in fall 2015.

Background:

Ohio Dominican University is submitting its request to ensure program alignment with Ohio standards and requirements. Programs leading to the Multi-Age TESOL Endorsement are valid for teaching students in prekindergarten through grade 12. Ohio Dominican University offers the program leading to the Multi-Age Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) Endorsement at the graduate level.

Recommendation:

Ohio Dominican University's Multi-Age TESOL Endorsement preparation program meets the Chancellor's requirements for program approval and the State Board of Education's minimum standards for graduate level programs leading to the Multi-Age TESOL Endorsement. Approval is recommended for Ohio Dominican University's graduate level program leading to the Multi-Age TESOL Endorsement until the spring 2022 review cycle. It should be noted that the program is subject to periodic review by the Chancellor to ensure that the standards for Ohio licensure continue to be met.
