Wilmington College

Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Integrated Language Arts License

Request:

Wilmington College requests approval to offer a baccalaureate level program leading to the Ohio Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Integrated Language Arts License.

Profile:

Wilmington College is an independent, not-for-profit institution affiliated with the Religious Society of Friends (Quaker) that was founded in 1870. The college has a specific mission to educate, inspire and prepare each student for a life of service and success. Located in Wilmington, Ohio, the college has an enrollment of nearly 1200 students enrolled in baccalaureate degrees in 25 areas and one master's degree at the main campus.

Accreditation/Authorization:

Wilmington College is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) until its next scheduled review in 2024. Wilmington College's educator preparation programs are accredited by Teacher Education Accreditation Council (TEAC) until the next review, by the successor organization, Council for Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP), in 2018.

Background:



Wilmington College is submitting its request to ensure program alignment with Ohio standards and requirements. Programs leading to the Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Integrated Language Arts License are valid for teaching students in grades 7 through 12. Wilmington College offers the program leading to the Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Integrated Language Arts License at the baccalaureate level.

Recommendation:



Wilmington College's Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Integrated Language Arts License preparation program meets the Chancellor's requirements for program approval and the State Board of Education's minimum standards for baccalaureate level programs leading to the Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Integrated Language Arts License. Approval is recommended for Wilmington College's baccalaureate level program leading to the Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Integrated Language Arts License until the fall 2024 review cycle. The Chancellor may, in his judgement, withdraw approval or require additional review if Wilmington College fails to meet the Chancellor's standards for licensure programs or receives a sanction by CAEP. Over the past three reporting years, fewer than ten candidates have completed the program. Due to the small number of completers in the program, the Ohio Educator Preparation Program

Performance Reports could not be considered in the review process to determine acceptable or unacceptable ranges.
