



## REQUEST AND RECOMMENDATION

### Wright State University

Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Physical Sciences: Chemistry Program Renewal

#### Request:

Wright State University requests renewal of authorization to offer a graduate program leading to the Ohio Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Physical Sciences: Chemistry license. This renewal ensures program alignment with Ohio standards and requirements. The program leading to the Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Physical Sciences: Chemistry license is valid for teaching in grades 7 through 12.

#### Profile:

Wright State University is a public university. The university was founded in 1967 with a specific mission to achieve learning outcomes through innovative, high quality programs for all students, to conduct scholarly research and creative endeavors, and to engage in significant community service. Located in Dayton, Ohio, the university has an enrollment of more than 12,000 undergraduate and over 4,000 graduate students.

#### Accreditation/Authorization:

Wright State University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) until its next scheduled review in 2026. Wright State University's educator preparation programs are accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) until the next review, by the successor organization, the Council for Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP), in 2023.

**Metrics Reported Data** (Per OAC 3333-1-05, data available and reported is limited to initial licensure and principal preparation only): Metrics reported on the Ohio Educator Preparation Program Performance Reports for these programs are within acceptable ranges as follows: graduate performance as measured by the Ohio Teacher Evaluation System; licensure pass rates of program completers; Ohio Value-Added Measure of PK-12 student learning of students taught by program graduates; admission requirements; field and clinical experiences; candidate perceptions of their preparation and graduate persistence in Ohio Resident Educator Program.

#### Recommendation:

Wright State University's Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Physical Sciences: Chemistry preparation program meets the Chancellor's requirements for program approval and the State Board of Education's minimum standards for graduate level programs. Approval is recommended until the fall 2027 review cycle. The Chancellor may, in his judgement, withdraw approval or require additional review if Wright State University fails to meet the Chancellor's standards for educator preparation programs or receives a sanction by CAEP.
