

Matriculation and Undergraduate Destinations of CCP Students

Task: Track the largest number of CCP students, those who matriculate, to undergraduate institutions.

Because CCP students in a given academic year can be from secondary grades between the seventh and the 12th, high-school graduation for them would be spread over six different years. Given that CCP was implemented in 2015-16 (starting with 2015 autumn), the earliest complete tracking of undergraduate destinations for all CCP students from 2015-16 would be possible in 2021-22. By the same token, the earliest complete tracking of CCP students from 2016-17 and 2017-18 to their undergraduate destinations would be possible in 2022-23 and 2023-24, respectively.

What we did: In light of the above, we tracked undergraduate destinations of CCP students who were high-school seniors and high-school juniors in 2015-16; the first group graduated from high-school in 2016 spring, and the second group graduated from high-school in 2017 spring.

Using currently available HEI data, we were able to track undergraduate enrollments of the 2015-16 high-school seniors between 2016 spring and 2018 spring – seven terms in total, and for the 2015-16 high-school juniors between 2017 spring and 2018 spring for – four terms in total.

It is important to note that CCP student counts available from the CCP Annual Report will not have a perfect match with the number of students in our sample due to the inclusion of multiple terms in the matriculation cohort.
