

# Six Year Success Measures

Fall 2013 Cohort of First-Time, Full-Time, Degree Seeking Undergraduate Students

*University System of Ohio Institutions*

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## Definitions

GROUPS	
<b>First-time, Full-time Students</b>	The students in this cohort must fulfill the following criteria: The students must be first-time ever undergrad in college in the fall term for the given year, enrolled in 12 or more hours in that fall term, and must be seeking a degree. The cohort may include students whose first term of enrollment is summer, if they continue their enrollment in fall. The cohort is limited to students enrolling as an undergraduate student for the first time. High school students attending college are not counted.
OUTCOMES	
<b>Number earning degree by end of 6th year</b>	Student has earned a bachelor's degree within 6 years or less at the same institution.
<b>Number persisting at same institution</b>	Students who have stayed at the same institution for the 6 year time frame but have not yet earned a bachelor's degree.
<b>Number persisting at a different institution</b>	Students who have moved on to a different institution than the original institution but have not yet earned a bachelor's degree.
<b>Number, total 6-Year success rate</b>	This is a sum of the students who earned a bachelor's degree or who remained enrolled in higher education.

<sup>1</sup> Northeast Ohio Medical University is not included in this report as it offers graduate degrees only and therefore does not fit into the framework of the success measure of bachelor degrees applied in this report.

<sup>2</sup> Shawnee State University has a higher percentage of students achieving associate degrees, compared with other 4-year state of Ohio institutions. If one factors in associates degrees as well as bachelor's degrees in calculating student success, Shawnee State's percentage of students earning a degree, and its overall success rate, increase to 34% and 43%, respectively. Its percentages of students persisting at a the same institution or a different institution fall slightly, from to 3%and 6%, respectively. All these alternative percentages are calculated using unduplicated student counts.

<sup>3</sup> University of Toledo data were unavailable in the format used for this table for the fall calendar year 2013 cohort. This data source shows an "Overall Graduation Rate" of 50% in a 6-year time frame (150% of normal time) for the fall cohort of calendar year 2013, and a "Graduation Rate for students pursuing Bachelor's Degrees" of 51% in a 6-year time frame (150% of normal time) for the fall cohort for Toledo in calendar year 2013.
