

The following table outlines how transfer credits will be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Social Work degree at Bowling Green State University for students who completed an Associate of Arts degree via the Ohio Guaranteed Social Work Transfer Pathway. The OGTP designation guarantees the transfer and applicability of credits, but does not guarantee admission to a program. Some bachelor-degree granting programs may be competitive, and students should check with individual institutions for their program admission requirements.

A minimum of 30 hours of paid or volunteer work in a social service agency is required for admission.</p> <p>⁶ Successful completion of WRIT 1120 with a "C or higher" is a BGSU graduation requirement.</p>

Advising Notes: ¹ Students must complete the Bowling Green Perspective (BGP) requirements, which include select courses that meet the International Perspective (could be satisfied by OSS001) and the Cultural Diversity in the United States (could be satisfied by OSS050) requirements at BGSU. Consult an advisor when selecting courses. ² At BGSU, some Social Work courses are only offered once a year, and others are sequenced. Students need to be aware of prerequisite courses and meet with their faculty mentor each semester to monitor their success and matriculation through the program. Students need to maintain a minimum GPA in both overall and core of 2.5 to remain in the Social Work Program. ³ BGSU requires a total of 122 credit hours for degree completion. The total number of hours in the third and fourth years represent a range of hours that may be needed depending on the individual course selections made during the first two years.
