It is not guaranteed to count toward a Bachelor of Music (BM) and would be evaluated on a course-by-course basis. Additional admission requirements for either the BA in Music or BM degree may include audition, portfolio, or other requirements that the receiving institution requires of its own students. Students should check with individual institutions for their program admission and degree requirements. Students may need to take additional coursework to meet required competencies.

Some bachelor-degree granting institutions require additional general education courses outside of the Ohio Transfer 36 and students may be required to take these courses in their junior or senior year. Students will still be able to follow this pathway and complete their bachelor's degree in approximately 60 additional credit hours.
