

DEFINITION OF AN OHIO TRANSFER 36 INTERDISCIPLINARY COURSE

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The Ohio Transfer 36 is comprised of five subject matter areas:

- English Composition/Oral Communication
- Mathematics, Statistics and Formal/Symbolic Logic
- Arts/Humanities
- Social and Behavioral Sciences
- Natural Sciences

An Ohio Transfer 36 interdisciplinary course is a general education course that has content in at least two of the subject matter areas listed above with credit hours for the individual course divided into those areas. For example, an Ohio Transfer 36 interdisciplinary 4 credit hour course could have course content in Social and Behavioral Sciences (2 hours of credit) and Arts/Humanities (2 hours of credit).

Approval Process for an Ohio Transfer 36 Interdisciplinary Course: For the Ohio Transfer 36 interdisciplinary course to be approved, it must be approved by all the Ohio Transfer 36 Faculty Review Panels representing the content areas of the interdisciplinary course.

An Ohio Transfer 36 interdisciplinary course should not be confused with an Ohio Transfer 36 course that can count as fulfilling the guidelines for two different content areas with the full credit hours being awarded in the specific content area that is selected. For example, an Ohio Transfer 36 3 credit hour course could count as both a Social and Behavioral Sciences course (3 credit hours) or an Arts/Humanities course (3 credit hours).

Approval Process for an Ohio Transfer 36 Course that Meets More than One Set of Ohio Transfer 36 Content Area Guidelines: For the Ohio Transfer 36 course to be approved as meeting two different Ohio Transfer 36 content guidelines, each Ohio Transfer 36 Faculty Review Panel has to approve the course. If only one Ohio Transfer 36 Faculty Review Panel approves the course, the Ohio Transfer 36 course is viewed as only being approved for that specific content area.
