

# OHIO ASPIRE ADULT WORKFORCE READINESS EDUCATION

## FY 2017 DESK REVIEW SUMMARY

*Reporting period - July 1, 2016 - June 30, 2017*

The Aspire Adult Workforce Readiness Education Programs, under the Chancellor of the Ohio Department of Higher Education, is required to 1) - show progress toward continuous improvement performance and 2) - evaluate the effectiveness of adult education and literacy activities based on the performance measures described in Title II of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). The Desk Review is the annual Aspire “report card” used to evaluate and communicate local program performance. The table below details participant outcomes for all Aspire adult education providers in Ohio.

### **IMPORTANT DEFINITIONS:**

- **PARTICIPANT** – an individual participating in an adult education program who has achieved 12 contact hours after program entry. These students constitute program enrollment and are counted toward Aspire performance measures.
- **PERSISTENCE** – average hours of instruction received by participants (total hours of instruction/enrollment).
- **COST/STUDENT** – average cost per participant or student (total expended/enrollment).
- **RETENTION** – the percentage of students who either achieved a Measurable Skill Gain (MSG) in the program year or who were progressing but had not achieved an MSG at the end of the program year.
- **EFL COMPLETION (EFL)** – federally mandated levels of performance in basic reading, writing, numeracy, and functional and workplace skills. There are six levels for Adult Basic Education and six levels for English for Speakers of Other Languages; the data below is displayed as the number of levels that met the minimum performance/the number of levels served.
- **MEASURABLE SKILL GAIN (MSG)** – the percentage of participants who completed at least one EFL as documented through a standardized assessment, by entering into postsecondary education or training after exit, or by attained a secondary school diploma or equivalent. The state target is 63%, as negotiated with Office of Career, Technical and Adult Education.
- **OVERALL SCORE/TIER** – determined by averaging the total points assessed for MSG, EFL Completion, and Other Performance Measures. Top Tier programs have overall percentages ranging from 72-100%, middle tier programs have percentages ranging from 44-72% and bottom tier programs have percentages ranging from 0-44%. **The average overall score for the state was 58%.**

Also provided for informational purposes are two rates by program – high school equivalency (HSE) pass rate and entry into postsecondary education or training (PSET). These rates were not used in the scoring of the Desk Review.

- **HSE PASS RATE** – the percentage of participants who attempted the high school equivalency and passed/completed in the fiscal year.
- **PSET RATE** – the percentage of participants who entered with a high school diploma/equivalent or higher, or who achieved an HSE while in the program and/or students who were in a transition program (programs whose services and instruction facilitate successful transitioning to postsecondary education, training, or employment).
