

## Guidance Document: Reading Endorsement Programs

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Must align to the <a href="#">Ohio Reading Competencies</a>.</li> <li>• Must be offered only at the graduate level               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Current Ohio Board of Regents (OBR) approval for all <b>existing undergraduate level</b> Reading Endorsement programs will expire on September 15, 2013.</li> <li>○ Students currently enrolled in currently approved undergraduate level programs may continue, however must complete the program by June 15, 2014.</li> <li>○ Institutions not currently holding OBR approval of a graduate level Reading Endorsement program may not admit new Reading Endorsement students in Spring 2013, Summer 2013 or Fall 2013.</li> <li>○ Institutions not currently holding OBR approval of a graduate level program that plan to seek Reading Endorsement program approval for student enrollment beginning in Spring 2014 must submit program proposals to the OBR by September 15, 2013.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Reading Endorsement programs must require a total of 15 to 21 course credit hours, with at least 75 percent of a candidate's course credits toward the endorsement earned at the graduate level.               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ While credit hours for reading coursework previously earned as part of an initial licensure program may be credited toward a maximum of 25 percent of the Reading Endorsement <b>program</b> completion requirements, no undergraduate hours may be credited toward post-baccalaureate <b>degree</b> requirements.</li> <li>○ Maximum credit allowed for previous coursework is: 3 course credit hours in a 15-course credit hour program; 4 course credit hours in a 16, 17, 18, or 19-course credit hour program; 5 course credit hours in a 20 or 21-course credit hour program.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Reading Endorsement program coursework must be aligned with the current Ohio approved modified International Reading Standards.</li> <li>• Reading Endorsement programs program requirements must include either 100 field hours distributed across K-12 grade levels or six hours of reading practicum delineated in the current Ohio approved modified International Reading standards.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Current Ohio educator license</li> <li>• Baccalaureate degree completion prior to enrollment</li> <li>• Applicants holding the Adolescent/Young Adult (AYA), multi-age, or career technical license must have completed a pre-requisite nine credit hours of undergraduate or graduate level reading sequence coursework before being admitted.</li> <li>• All other applicants must have completed the pre-requisite 12 semester credit hours of undergraduate or graduate level reading sequence coursework before being admitted</li> <li>• Pre-requisite coursework is stipulated in Ohio Revised Code 3319.24:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Must include at least one separate three semester hour course in the teaching of phonics</li> <li>○ Must include coursework on:                   <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ knowledge and beliefs about reading</li> <li>▪ knowledge base</li> <li>▪ individual differences</li> <li>▪ reading difficulties</li> <li>▪ creating a literate environment</li> <li>▪ word identification</li> <li>▪ vocabulary and spelling</li> <li>▪ comprehension</li> <li>▪ study strategies</li> <li>▪ writing</li> <li>▪ assessment</li> <li>▪ communicating information about reading</li> <li>▪ curriculum development</li> <li>▪ professional development</li> <li>▪ research</li> <li>▪ supervision of paraprofessionals</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Achieve a passing score on the state-approved educator reading test</li> <li>• Achieve assessment results at or above institutionally-established threshold scores on multiple performance-based assessments throughout program</li> </ul>
