- Breakfast and lunch on meeting days



Metrics reporting change

There will be a change to metrics reporting requirements for the 2013 Performance Reports. The data entry for 2013 will require input of assessment composite scores and sub-scores for ACT, SAT, Praxis I, GRE, and Praxis II by program level (undergraduate post baccalaureate and graduate) and by admitted, enrolled, and completed status.

Reporting at the sub-score level aligns with Ohio's college readiness requirements as well as the Ad Hoc Committee on Candidate Academic Measures recommendations to the Chancellor.



Program review processes


As Ohio moves forward in the transition to the CAEP program review and accreditation processes, OBR will no longer conduct program review simultaneous to an accreditation visit. All program reviews must be completed prior to the accreditation visit.

Council for Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) standards development, review, and implementation timeline

In June the CAEP Commission will review the public comments on the draft standards for all educator preparation providers¹. The Commission will forward the revised standards to the CAEP Board of Directors this summer. The entire development timeline is included below.

PARCC assessment development continues

The development of the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) assessments is progressing along the planned timeline. Ohio is a governing state in the PARCC consortium and will employ the PARCC assessments as a key element in assessing K-12 student learning. The PARCC assessments are aligned with the Common Core State Standards, which are included in the new Ohio Learning Standards.
