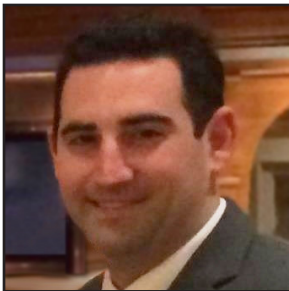


SESSION IV – VETERANS SERVICES ON CAMPUS



Michael Carrell is an Assistant Provost and Director of the Office of Military & Veterans Services for The Ohio State University (OSU). In this role, he leads OSU's implementation of a strategic plan for Ohio State's path to become the first choice for military members, veterans, and their families. His efforts are transforming the university's approach and delivery of military and veterans services. Prior to this position, Carrell was a Professor of Aerospace Science, Department Chair, and Commander of Air Force ROTC at OSU and had a 23-year military career. Colonel Carrell commanded at the Air Defense Sector/Wing, Group, Squadron, and Flight Levels in the Air Force. He led organizations as large as 3900 people and in his last operational assignment was responsible for the safety, morale, and welfare of

over 42,000 people across 4000 buildings on 40,000 acres, and \$9B in assets and budget at America's only Tri-Service Joint Base. A Master Air Battle Manager, he was qualified on 3 Command and Control weapons systems. Carrell holds multiple graduate degrees, completed his post-graduate fellowship at Harvard's John F Kennedy School of Government, and has numerous years working both as a military educator and guest lecturer in civilian universities.



James Favuzzi has been the Manager of the Military & Veteran Services Dept. at Columbus State since it was created in 2012. He is an Army Veteran of multiple overseas combat deployments and a current member of The U.S. Army Reserves. Jay has held leadership and has command positions at multiple echelons. He earned a BA in History from The State University of New York at Potsdam and is also a graduate of The U.S. Army John F. Kennedy Special Warfare Center and School, The U.S. Army Military Police School and U.S. Army Command & General Staff College. He also holds a Masters Certificate in Stability, Security & Development in Complex Operations from the Naval Postgraduate School and was presented with The U.S. Dept. of State Franklin Award for Public Diplomacy in 2012. Jay

served four years with the 10th Mountain Division (LI) and later worked at The Ohio State University as an Assistant Professor of Military Science and Leadership for four years prior to joining the Columbus State team. Jay is an avid high performance boater and enjoys coaching youth hockey in his free time. Jay is also a member of the National Association of 10th Mountain Division (LI), Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1060 and The European Paratroopers Association.
