<i>Credit Hour Recommendation:</i> 3 Semester Hours
<i>Prerequisites:</i> None
<i>Suggested Topics:</i> Course should deal with structures and processes of state and local government and relationships with federal government, with special emphasis on Ohio as a case study.
<i>Related TAG:</i> Political Science
<i>Course Description:</i> This course examines the political processes and institutions of U.S. state and local government. Topics include state and local politics; state constitutions, municipal corporations and charters; political participation; institutions and processes; intergovernmental relations; political parties and interest groups; and policy issues and outcomes in state/local government with special reference to Ohio.
Students will demonstrate an understanding of:
1. Structure/Functions of state and local governments and intergovernmental relationships.
2. Theoretical and historical underpinnings of state constitutions and local charters.
3. State and local political processes such as electoral, judicial, and fiscal systems.
